Course content:

- Creation of human consciousness and spirit in Science
- The world after the creation and the operation of environmental systems

Course requirements:

Completion of the course requires active participation in seminar classes (minimum 90%), preparation of course assignments on topics issued by the lecturer, and their discussion. Submission of final essay.
